ABOUT THE ARTIST

IGNACY ZALEWSKI

Composer of orchestral, chamber, film, theater and radio music, composer/conductor/violinist Ignacy Zalewski is the winner of over twenty international awards. His compositions have been recorded on 19 CDs and are performed in the most important Polish concert halls and in most European countries, as well as in the USA, China, Japan, Singapore, and Vietnam.

In the years 2009-2014, he studied composition under the supervision of Prof. Marcin Błażewicz at the Chopin University of Music in Warsaw, receiving a diploma with highest honors. In 2014-2015 he was a student of Krzysztof Penderecki. He has also participated in numerous European workshops including with composers Wolfgang Rihm (Hochschule für Musik Karlsruhe), Vladimir Scolnic (Jerusalem Academy of Music), and many others.

In addition to his large output of classical works, Zalewski is also active as composer for dozens of theatre, film, television, and radio productions. In the field of film and television, he has collaborated with WFDiF, Netflix, Bagatela Studio, TVP Television Theatre, TVP Kultura, and Granator Studio. Theatre productions with Ignacy's original music are staged in the most important theaters across Poland, including the Slowacki Theatre in Krakow, the Dramatic Theatre in Warsaw, the Jewish Theatre in Warsaw, the Silesian Theatre in Katowice, and the Solski Theatre in Tarnów. The composer also constantly collaborates with the Polish Radio Theatre.

Zalewski obtained his Ph.D. in 2015 and D.Sc. in 2020. He is a professor at the Chopin University of Music and, for the 2020-2024 term, was Dean of the Faculty of Composition and Music Theory. In May 2019, Zalewski was the music director / conductor for the European premiere production of "The End of Al Capone," an opera by Butler University's Composer-in-Residence, Michael Schelle.
